Zipflat from Portable Composite Structures, Inc. has announced a joint effort with Habitat for Humanity to build a community center in Honduras in mid 2011. Donations and a volunteer build team are "ready to deploy" says PCS.

Honduras is the third poorest country in Latin America and the second poorest country in Central America. The country is prone to hurricanes and flooding, particularly in the areas close to the Caribbean coast. Hurricane Mitch, which hit Honduras in late 1998 caused widespread destruction of basic economic and social infrastructure, rural housing and food crops.

According to the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) one of the contributors to poverty in Honduras is fragile social conditions. "Our mission is to provide resources so that families work together to rebuild the community, as well as rebuild their own home.
